LIGHTING

When taking your photo, lighting is key, natural light is always best. If you have a special lighting feature, a night shot can be a beautiful addition, otherwise stick to during the daylight.

FOCUS

Choose a focal point for each shot, we can see the best parts when you have a defined focal point.

ANGLES & FRAMING

When taking a photo of your SheShed cabin, it's often helpful to find a straight edge and line up your camera on your phone so that the walls look straight on your screen. If taking photos outside think about framing with trees or landscapes.

DETAILS

We love seeing interior and exterior details. Have you added a deck, or maybe beautiful landscaping or a lovely business you are running from your SheShed? We would love to see the special details that you have put into your cabin.

MORE
